IB Diploma Psychology Field Trip

This week our IB Diploma psychology students (12th grade), visited the Ministry of Defense wounded warrior rehabilitation center of Georgia. Students had the opportunity to meet not only the team of clinical psychologists who are currently working with the war veterans (who underwent peacekeeping missions abroad, in Iraq, Afghanistan and Africa), but also the wounded warriors of Georgia themselves. The psychological team provided a guided tour through the building and introduced the specifics of the service and the framework of psychological interventions they are using to support the soldiers and their family members. As IB psychology have students studied Abnormal Psychology, and more precisely PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder), with its biological and neural changes in the brain, as well as medical and therapeutic treatments, it was fundamentally important for them to apply the factual knowledge to the real world environment, as the core ideology of the whole IB program states. Students were able to witness real-life therapy sessions and hear from those undergoing the therapy about its benefits and procedure itself. As they had vast amounts of knowledge on the common therapeutic approaches, seeing real-life examples guaranteed the understanding of a topic, that is not only coming from scientific research and books but the real-world applications, which is significantly more meaningful than just theoretical knowledge.

Annual Secondary Award Ceremony

The Secondary Awards were a great success and celebration of achievement. Awards were given for each subject and demonstration of BGA core values at each grade level, as well as for those students who have a 100% attendance record. Additionally, the Principal's Award was presented to a student in each grade showing outstanding academic achievement and positive behaviour across the board. It was a pleasure to see our secondary students applauding the success of their classmates and friends.
